health agencies based on evidence!

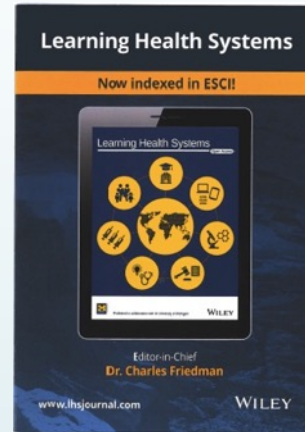


H3IT Brings an Evidence-Based Approach and Contributes to **Learning Health Systems**

An Evidence-Based Approach can be proactive, but it is different from a hype-based approach



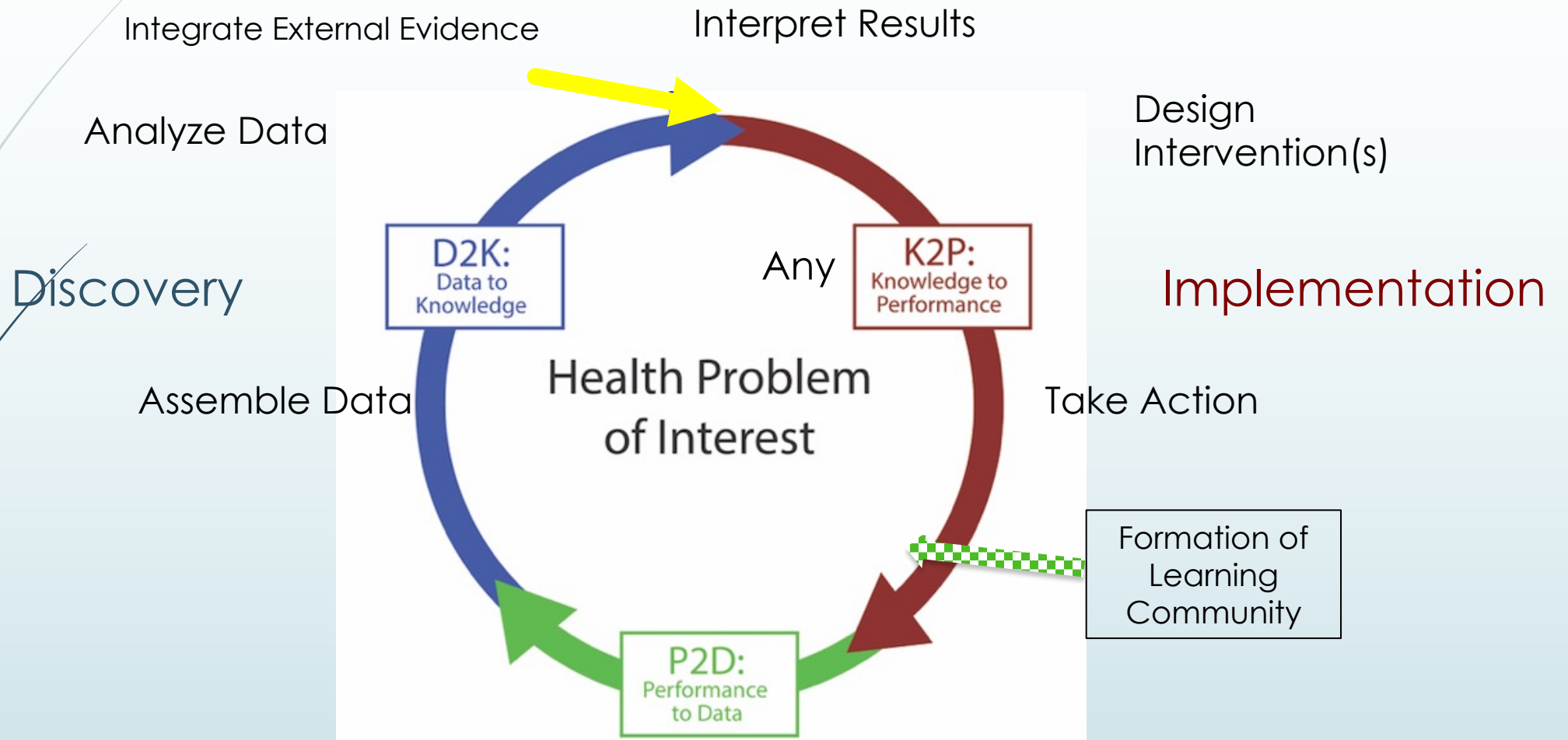

Learning Health Systems: A Learning Cycle



H3IT Unique Characteristics



- Focused community
- Interdisciplinary++
- Applied
- Collaboration between research and practice
- Aims to achieve
 - Data to Knowledge
 - Knowledge to Performance
 - Performance to Data



H3IT – Unique Contribution

- Tackles a hard problem
- IT Adoption in resource-limited settings
 - Moving into the future, this might be even a more important issue
- Resource limitations bring together high risks in terms of successful IT adoption that positively impacts outcomes
- Although there are high risks, there is little evidence and evidence-based recommendations in home health and hospice, compared to other settings.
- That's why H3IT fills an important gap
- The members of H3IT did an incredible job over the last decade to bridge this knowledge gap.
